When Resident Artists graduate from AVA, they are prepared to share their gifts with audiences around the world, fulfilling not only their own hopes and dreams, but those of AVA's wise and generous founder, Helen Corning Warden.

Gifted singers come to Philadelphia from all over the world to seek the exceptional guidance and training that the Academy of Vocal Arts offers. Admission to the tuition-free program is determined yearly by competitive auditions. While hundreds of hopeful singers apply, only 8-10 are accepted into the four-year program.

It is my pleasure to present High Notes, the annual report of the Academy of Vocal Arts. This report covers our most recent fiscal year, from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019. Aside from working on the four fully-staged operas and singing in frequent concerts, recitals, lectures, and informal gatherings, the Resident Artists were busy preparing for the demands of their future professional careers. They receive many hours of vocal training and coaching each week, in addition to lessons in languages, stage combat, stage interpretation, and professional development. Behind the success of each AVA Resident Artist is the outstanding AVA faculty.

2018-2019 was another successful year of accomplishments at AVA, and our Resident Artists won many major awards: Piotr Buszewski, Meryl Dominguez, Gabriela Flores, Mackenzie Gotcher, Rebecca Gulinello, Ethan Vincent, and Hannah Ludwig (AVA '18) were 2018 Philadelphia District Winners of the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions. Meryl Dominguez advanced to the Semi-Final round, and Piotr Buszewski was named a 2019 National Finalist. Mr. Buszewski also won 1st prize in the Loren L. Zachary National Vocal Competition and was named an Encouragement Award winner at the Operalia World Opera Competition. Ethan Vincent won 1st place, the Audience Choice and the Ava Franchi Music Awards at the Vero Beach Opera Rising Stars Competition, and he was the Second Prize Winner of the 2019 Nicola Martinucci Competition in Lucca, Italy. He also won the YAVI Concert Series Grant, awarded by the Gerda Lissner Foundation.

We also graduated eight Resident Artists to promising careers. Piotr Buszewski, Meryl Dominguez, Gabriela Flores, Roy Hage, John Matthew Myers, Ethan Vincent, Matthew White, and Anthony Whitson-Martini graduated with Artist Diplomas, and we wish them all well!

We hope that you had the opportunity to join us this past season to see our Resident Artists in action. Please consider supporting us in the upcoming season, by attending AVA performances and contributing to the tuition-free training of these outstanding young artists. Thank you for being a valuable member of the AVA family. It is through your support that the Resident Artists and the Academy of Vocal Arts continue to enjoy great success!

THE 2018/19 SEASON

The Academy of Vocal Arts presented over forty concerts and performances with approximately 10,000 attendees during the 2018-2019 season.

The Opera Theatre season began with a black-tie Opening Night Celebration, which featured a double-bill of Puccini's one-act operas: *Le Villi*, conducted by Richard A. Raub, and *Suor Angelica*, conducted by Maestro Christofer Macatsoris. Directed by David Gately, this unique two-part production lent itself beautifully to a celebratory evening of hors d'oeuvres, a seated dinner, dessert and a Champagne toast to the 2018-19 season! In addition to Center City performances, this double-bill was performed in Haverford, Bucks County, and at the Zoellner Arts Center at Lehigh University.

This winter, Antonín Dvořák's *Rusalka* was performed for the very first time at AVA! The production, which was directed by K. James McDowell, featured beautiful lush greenery as the backdrop for wood sprites and water nymphs in this fairytale-inspired opera, and Music Director Luke Housner accompanied at the piano.

The spring production of Mozart's *Così fan tutte* was conducted by Maestro Christofer Macatsoris and directed by Dorothy Danner, and it was performed in Center City and Haverford.

The season's final opera was Charles Gounod's *Roméo et Juliette*. Conducted by Steven Mosteller and directed by Jeffrey Marc Buchman, it was staged in Center City, Bucks County, and Haverford.

Resident Artists also sang in the annual Giargiari Bel Canto Competition, which was held at the Kimmel Center's Perelman Theater. Rebecca Gulinello won 1st Prize, Brent Michael Smith won 2nd Prize, and Meryl Dominguez won the Audience Favorite Award. Following the competition, audience members were treated to a special surprise performance by AVA alumnus and newly-named Vice President of Global and Artistic Outreach, Bryan Hymel.

AVA subscribers and patrons were invited to Opera Previews throughout the season. These free and informal lectures have continued to be very popular with our audiences, as they are a great way to get a behind-the-scenes look at the rehearsal process while learning more about the opera.

Other concerts this season included the New Artist Recital, Russian Romances, *Jubilate!*, a program of German song repertoire, a program of French song repertoire, and the Farewell Recital.

At intermission, Young Professionals enjoyed wine and light bites in the front hall and in the courtyard. Following the performance, they were invited to a Champagne toast, where they congratulated the singers.

This inaugural event was a great success, and we look forward to inviting Young Professionals back to AVA in the 2019-2020 season!

The 2018-2019 Opera Outreach program engaged students from twenty-seven public, private, charter and home school groups across the greater Philadelphia region. Many long-time participants attended the performances, along with several new participants. Over 1,300 students, teachers, and chaperones attended special matinee performances of Puccini's *Le Villi* and Gounod's *Roméo et Juliette*.

Prior to each matinee, students and teachers received comprehensive study guides, which outlined the history of the specific opera, while also providing general information about opera as an art form.

Following each performance, the Resident Artists remained onstage to answer questions from eager audience members.

ZACH BORICHEVSKY will sing the role of Cassio in *Otello* with the Washington National Opera, as well as the Duke in *Rigoletto* with Nashville Opera.

This past season, **STEPHEN COSTELLO** made his role debut as Pinkerton in *Madama Butterfly* in his first opera performance in Japan. This summer, he sang the role of the Duke in *Rigoletto* at the Bregenz Festival, and Alfredo in *La traviata* in the Arena de Verona. He will sing the roles of Rodolfo in *La bohème* in Dresden, the Prince in *Rusalka* in both Mulhouse and Strasbourg, Leicester in *Maria Stuarda* at the Metropolitan Opera, and Le Chevalier des Grieux in *Manon*, as well as Ferrando in *Così fan tutte* in Paris.

ANDRÉ COURVILLE appeared as the Jailer in *Tosca* with the Philadelphia Orchestra at the Vail Music Festival this summer. He will sing the title role in *Le nozze di Figaro* with Kentucky Opera, as well as the role of Bartolo/Antonio in *Figaro* with the Opéra National de Bordeaux and with Les Musiciens du Louvre in Israel.

ELLIE DEHN will sing the role of Mimi in *La bohème* with Arizona Opera and Donna Anna in *Don Giovanni* with Michigan Opera Theatre.

Highlights of **JOYCE DIDONATO'S** upcoming season include the title roles in *Agrippina* and *Semiramide* with the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden and the Gran Teatre del Liceu, respectively. She will return to the Metropolitan Opera to sing the role of Charlotte in *Werther*, and she will also continue on her worldwide tour with Il Pomo d'Oro to present her album, *In War and Peace*. In September, Joyce was named "Female Singer of the Year" for her new album "Songplay" by OPUS KLASSIK.

JOYCE EL-KHOURY'S debut solo album, "Écho," received a Juno Nomination for Classical Album of the Year. She was also listed in Operawire's "Best of 2018" list. This season she will return to the Canadian Opera Company to sing the role of Liù in *Turandot*.

MICHAEL FABIANO will sing many roles this season, including the role of Chevalier des Grieux in *Manon* at the Metropolitan Opera this fall. He will return to the Opéra National de Paris to sing the title roles in both *Don Carlo* and *Les contes d'Hoffmann*. He will sing the role of Don José in *Carmen* at the Staatsoper unter den Linden in Berlin, Alfredo in *La traviata* at the Teatro Real de Madrid, and he will return to the title role in *Don Carlo* at the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden. He recently released his debut solo recording of arias by Verdi and Donizetti.

OTHALIE GRAHAM will sing the role of Lady Macbeth with both Toledo Opera as well as Opera Carolina. She will appear as a soloist with the Sacramento Choral Society and the Reading Symphony Orchestra for the Verdi *Requiem*, and she will also appear as the Soprano Soloist with the Mississippi Symphony and the Delaware Symphony Orchestra for Beethoven's Ninth.

PATRICK GUETTI sang the role of Snug in *A Midsummer Night's Dream* with Opera Philadelphia last season. He will make his Metropolitan Opera debut as Sarastro in the Julie Taymor production of *The Magic Flute*. JONAS HACKER made his main-stage debut as the Novice in Britten's *Billy Budd* with Central City Opera this summer. This fall, he will make his debut with Arizona Opera, singing the role of Timothy Laughlin in *Fellow Travelers*. He will join the Philadelphia Orchestra as the Tenor Soloist in Bach's *Mass in B Minor* with Yannick Nézet-Séguin, as well as the Tenor Soloist in Handel's *Messiah*.







Operating income consists of revenue from a variety of sources. Like many schools, the largest single revenue source for AVA is the investment income from its endowment. Unlike other schools or conservatories, AVA receives no income from tuition, and therefore must rely on support from our loyal patrons. Individual contributions, ticket sales, and special events, including the annual Gala, provide most of the remainder of our budget. In recent years, planned gifts and bequests are providing ever more important revenue support. The two largest expenditures in AVA’s budget, program payroll and benefits, along with opera theatre expenses, are directly related to the training program.
